Field Day!

Field Day fun at Chilao Campground

The Independent Radio Club held its first Field Day event June 22 & 23 at Chilao Campground in the Angeles National Forest. It was unseasonably hot but we had a great time. We had a lot of hams participating and had a nice station set up. We operated as a 3A entry this year with 3 HF transmitters and 1 VHF/UHF transmitter. We also operated a separate satellite station for AO-40.

Much skin and a shirt or two was sacrificed to erect our antenna system. We put up a G5RV, 140' ladder line fed doublet, 450' long wire, a tri-band wire beam, 6 M rotateable dipole, 2M/440 beam, and a 2M/440 omni. Brian W2BRI erected a 30'+ mast to raise the VHF/UHF antennas. Most of us didn't think the mast would support the antennas, but Brian got it airborne.

We operated on every band from 160M-70cm (except 220 and the WARC bands) SSB, FM and digital. We ran a weak signal VHF station, a PSK-31 station, a SSTV station, as well as two HF SSB stations. We

Our Repeater Status

Still Waiting for SCRBBA

We are still trying to obtain coordination for our 440 repeater, the KF6OHR machine. The repeater is located on Contractors Point in the hills above Sylmar. We are currently operating on the SCRBBA test pair 446.860 – PL 156.7 until we receive our coordination.

Currently, the repeater is a "vanilla" machine with only basic features. Johnathan KF6OHR has big plans for the machine after we get coordinated. We plan to link into a machine located on Hauser Peak which would bring our system back to the level of the old system. We also are considering incorporating the following features:

- Autopatch
- Reverse Autopatch
- IRLP Internet repeater linking
- Voter Receivers / Passive Reflector

Johnathan is open to adding additional features as we get the system developed. The major system improvements are currently on hold until we get our coordination squared away.

We have been testing our repeater since February and it has been operating consistently and reliably. We have received correspondence from SCRBBA that they are working on getting us a channel and that they expect to have a frequency for us in the near future. This is not a quick process but persistence will get us on the air.

Johnathan is about to swap out the current repeater with another one that will use a PC as a controller. K1RFD wrote a repeater control program called

EchoStation which we are going to use to run the PC. is a very interesting **EchoStation** program. EchoStation can be set up as a full duplex repeater, a simplex repeater, a simplex autopatch machine, or an announcement machine. The sound card in the computer is used to interface the computer with the radio. The software will allow us to use the modem to make an autopatch connection in either the normal or reverse direction. The software has a voice synthesizer to do voice ID's and announcements which can be scheduled and varied. If you are interested, the software can be downloaded on the Internet and can be used for 30 days at no charge. It can be registered for \$20 and would make a good controller for an emergency repeater.

You can help us get the repeater coordinated. Get out and talk on it! The more we use it the more attractive we look to SCRBBA for coordination. We know that the machine has less than desirable coverage, but using it is a chicken and egg kind of thing. More use will get us coordinated, which will allow us to improve the system which will make it more useful. Less use delays coordination, which delays making it more useful. Let's burn up the airwaves and have SCRBBA kick us off the test pair!
