2005 Field Day

Join us for Field Day at the beach!

Through some luck and good timing, we were able to make reservations at Mc Grath State Beach for Field Day. Mc Grath State Beach is just south of Oxnard off highway 101. Field Day set up will start at 12:00 noon Friday June 24. Field Day will start 11:00am Saturday June 25 and will go for the next 24 hours.

The campsite has showers and flush toilets, but no RV hookups. The campsite fees are \$30 per night (with a 2 night minimum) plus \$8 per night for each additional vehicle. The campsites are large enough that two families could share one site. We have seven sites reserved and four are already taken. If you don't want to camp, you are welcome to come up for the day and operate or just hang out.

On Saturday night we will be having our traditional potluck dinner. Please bring a side dish and the drinks of your choice and the club will provide the main course. Our dinner is always a highlight of Field Day.

This year we plan to run a 3A battery station. We plan to operate on 75, 40, 20, 15, 10, 6 and 2 meters, 125cm, 70cm and 23cm. We will be running SSTV, PSK31 as well as weak signal VHF/UHF work. If you are interested in seeing or trying any of these modes make sure to come on by.

Right after Field Day at 1:00pm Sunday June 26, we will be holding a VE testing session. If you are looking for an upgrade, be sure to crack the books.

We <u>must</u> have your reservations by May 20. The club has to pay for the sites 30 days in advance and if we don't think we can fill them we will drop them. To register, contact Ken W6CPA at <u>w6cpa@arrl.net</u>. See you at the beach!

Our technician class is coming up even sooner. If you know anyone who is interested in getting a license, tell them about our class. One day if all is well and we keep staying in the black, we have plans to expand the Echolink station and to move it up to the repeater site. This would make the Echolink station more usable by everybody. Currently, only members in the valley can use it. We would like to make it available to everyone.

I'd like to give special thanks to Juan W6DMV for letting us put the 900 MHz repeater at his house. Thanks to Larry KG6EJT for doing such a great job on the web site. Thanks as always to Mr. Lowell KG6AJF our net controller who is a lot of fun and takes care of us all. Thanks to Brian W2BRI for maintaining and operating the Echolink system. 900MHz Repeater online

Our new 900 MHz repeater is now in service

We have completed the installation of our 900 MHz repeater at Juan's (W6DMV) residence in South Pasadena. Juan is fortunate to live right on top of a hill. The 900 MHz repeater is linked into our 440 MHz machine on Contractors Point. This system should extend our coverage into the Eagle Rock/San Gabriel Valley area and possibly out into Long Beach/Orange County. The repeater is at 927.9625 MHz minus split with a PL of 100.0 Hz. The repeater split in the 33cm band is 25 MHz.

There is no amateur gear available for the 900 MHz band, however commercial gear is available which can be modified to go into the ham band. We have gotten a hold of some Motorola GTX 900 radios, which can be easily modified with software to go into the ham band. The radio has a portable version and a mobile version. If you are interested in giving 900 MHz a try we will be offering GTX portables and mobiles we've been able to pick up on the surplus market. Quantities are limited so talk to Leon KC6JAR about price and availability.

Technician License Class

Do you know anyone who wants a ham ticket?

The IRC is offering a technician license class and VE testing session May 21 and 22. The class will be held at Eagle Rock City Hall, 2035 Colorado Blvd, Eagle Rock. Eagle Rock City Hall is located on Colorado Boulevard near the Hwy 134/ Hwy 2 interchange. The class will run 9:00am to 5:00pm Saturday May 21 and 10:00am to 3:00pm Sunday May 22. The class will be followed by a VE testing session sponsored by the IRC.

We have found that taking a technician class over one weekend and immediately testing right afterward is much more successful than taking classes over a series of weeks. Testing the student before he has a chance to forget the material works very well.

Signing up at the class is ok, but we would prefer it if you would preregister. You can preregister by emailing Ken at w6cpa@arrl.net or by printing and mailing in the coupon from our web site at www.ircradio.org. One advantage of preregistration is that prestudy will increase your chances of success dramatically. The cost of the class is \$45. The cost includes a study book and the required VE testing fee. Should you fail the first test and need to take a second test a \$14 additional fee is required. All students should bring picture ID and their social security number (the SSN is required by the FCC).

The VE testing session on Sunday May 22 at 3:00 pm is open to all. We will be offering all test elements so it's a perfect time to upgrade. You need the following items to take a test, a picture ID, \$14 in check or cash, a copy of your license (if any), and any CSCE forms. Please have a copy of your existing license and exact change for the test fee. You can still take a test if you don't bring a copy of the license, but you will only receive credit for the elements passed. Any license upgrade would be held up for ARRL VEC verification.
