## Field Day in the Pines

Field Day at Table Mountain

Spring is in the air and it's time for Field Day. Field Day is Saturday June 24 & Sunday June 25. Setup will begin at 11:00am Friday and operating will begin at 11:00am Saturday. This year we will be operating at Table Mountain campground in Broken Blade loop. Table Mountain campground is located in the Angeles National Forest about five miles west of the town of Wrightwood.

Campsites are on a first come first served basis and cost \$15 per night. Leon KC6JAR will hold one for you if you contact him at <u>kc6jar@ircradio.org</u> or on the repeater. Everyone should bring camping gear and your own food. You will not want to miss our traditional potluck dinner on Saturday night. The club will provide the main course and you need to provide your own drinks and a side dish.

We plan to operate on all bands from 160 meters to 23 centimeters. Table Mountain has enough space to run some nice antennas. We plan to run a 3A battery station which will have 3 HF transmitters and a VHF/UHF weak signal station. We will be running 2 HF phone stations and 1 HF digital/CW station. We will be operating SSB, FM, PSK-31, SSTV, RTTY and APRS.

We need to round up batteries, rope and some portable shade. If you can help with any of these items, let Leon or Ken W6CPA know. We should have plenty of rigs to use but feel free to bring your to try if you wish. For more details and a map go to our website http://www.ircradio.org/fieldday2006.htm.

We will also be holding a VE testing session after Field Day at 1:00pm Sunday June 25 at the campground. Field Day and an upgrade. What could be better? and make Field Day a good time for all so you won't want to miss it.

# **Club License Classes**

Our next Technician license class is in May

Our next technician license class will be held on Saturday May 20 and Sunday May 21 at Eagle Rock City Hall. Eagle Rock City Hall is located at 2035 Colorado Blvd in Eagle Rock. The class will run from 9am to 5pm on Saturday and 9am to 3pm on Sunday.

On Sunday May 21 at 3:00pm, we will sponsor a VE testing session. The VE session will be open to the public so we encourage you to come by if you want to upgrade. To take a test you need to bring \$14 in exact change or check, a picture ID, a pencil and a copy of your license.

The cost of the class is \$50 which includes the study book and the testing fee. We have found that a weekend class with a test session directly after the class is the most effective way to get a license.

If you know of anyone who is interested in getting a ham ticket, please let them know about our class. This will be one of the last chances to take the technician test before the question pool changes on July 1.

In July we will be holding a weekend general license class with a VE testing session directly after at Eagle Rock City Hall. The cost of the class is \$50 which includes the study book and the testing fee. Hopefully by then we will know what the FCC intends to do about the code requirements. When the FCC announces the new code requirements, we will try to do a General class on the fly.

We have one more technician class this year in October at Eagle Rock City Hall.

Currently there is a shortage of VE testing sessions in the San Fernando Valley. We would like to start doing regular testing sessions in the future. If you have an idea for a place we can hold them, please let us know. You can also help out by becoming a VE.

# **IRLP Operating**

Talk around the world with your handheld

The Contractors Point repeaters have access to IRLP node 3030. IRLP (Internet Relay Linking Project) allows you to connect the repeater to a repeater or simplex radio in another location through the internet. You may have heard stations from distant locations operating through the repeater.

To talk to a station coming into the system via IRLP, just use the repeater normally. When working an IRLP station, you should leave long pauses between transmissions to allow links to clear.

To initiate an IRLP connection from the repeater you need to send a code to set the controller to receive IRLP commands. You then send the connect code for the node you want to visit. You can see the nodes available at <u>http://status.irlp.net</u>. If you would like to give the IRLP a try, e mail ken <u>w6cpa@ircradio.org</u> and he will send you the codes.
