Field Day at the Beach

Don't miss Field Day at El Capitan State Beach!

It's almost time for Field Day and this year we will be operating at the Cabrillo group camp at El Capitan State Beach. The beach is located 17 miles west of Santa Barbara off highway 101. (Talk in 446.000 or 147.000+ PL 131.8) We plan to run a 3A battery station consisting of 3 HF transmitters and 1 VHF/UHF weak signal station. We will be operating on every FD band from 80 Meters to 23 cm. We will be running phone, HF digital, SSTV, CW and maybe some other modes.

Set up starts 11:00 am Friday June 22 and operating begins 11:00 am Saturday June 23 for 24 hours. We've reserved the campsite for Thursday night so you can come up Thursday if you like. The group camp is set up for tents only; however there is a parking lot next to the site where you can park trailers as long as we are low key about it. The campground has potable water, flush toilets and fire pits. You are welcome to bring your own rig; however, we should have plenty of radios for everyone to operate.

On Saturday we are having our traditional potluck dinner. We ask everyone to bring a side dish and their own drinks. The club will provide the main dish. Dinner is always a lot of fun so plan on staying for dinner even if you are just coming up for the day. We will be conducting a VE testing session on Sunday 1 pm after Field Day at the campsite. This is your last chance to take the general exam before they change the question pool July 1.

D-Star System Status

Things are starting to come together

We have finally (for now) resolved our equipment issues with Icom and the entire local repeater system is operational (2 meters, 70 cm, 23 cm). We have been assigned a test coordination for the 2 meter repeater which may move in the future depending on how our test works out. You should check the D-Star web site frequently for the latest system status www.ladstar.org.

The last step in the process is the internet gateway set up which has been a big stumbling block for us. The gateway allows us to connect to other D-Star repeaters in the national network. The gateway server must be at the repeater site so we need to get a high speed internet connection there. We are ready to implement the gateway as soon as we can get the internet connection going. We are trying a couple of different ideas and we will get it worked out soon. Check the web site for details.

General License Class

It's time to get off you duff and get on HF!

Now that the code is gone there is no excuse for not upgrading! The IRC is offering a general license class and VE testing session July 14 and 15. The class will be held at Eagle Rock City Hall, 2035 Colorado Blvd, Eagle Rock. Eagle Rock City Hall is located on Colorado Boulevard near the Hwy 134/ Hwy 2 interchange. The class will run 9:00am to 5:00pm Saturday July 14 and 9:00am to 3:00pm Sunday July 15. The class will be followed by a VE testing session sponsored by the IRC.

We have found that taking a license class over one weekend and immediately testing right afterward is much more successful than taking classes over a series of weeks. Testing the student before he has a chance to forget the material works very well.

Signing up at the class is ok, but we would prefer it if you would preregister. You can preregister by emailing Ken at w6cpa@ircradio.org or by printing and mailing in the coupon from our web site at www.ircradio.org. One advantage of preregistration is that prestudy will increase your chances of success dramatically.

The cost of the class is \$50. The cost includes a study book and the required VE testing fee. Should you fail the first test and need to take a second test a \$14 additional fee is required. All students should bring picture ID and their social security number or FRN.

The VE testing session on Sunday July 15 at 3:00 pm is open to all. We will be offering all test elements so it's a perfect time to upgrade. You need the following items to take a test, a picture ID, \$14 in check or cash, a copy of your license (if any), and any CSCE forms. Please have a copy of your existing license that we can keep and exact change for the test fee. You can still take a test if you don't bring a copy of the license, but you will only receive credit for the elements passed. Any license upgrade would be held up for ARRL VEC verification.
