D-Star System News

Status of the D-Star Repeater System

We have finally made significant progress with our D-Star repeater system. D-Star is an open digital radio protocol developed by the JARL. At the present time Icom is the only manufacturer supporting the D-Star system commercially.

We have been struggling with getting our internet gateway going for the system for a year but we have finally solved our problem of having internet access at the repeater site. We have the internet gateway portion of the system running and have full connectivity through the system. The implementation of the gateway will allow us to connect our D-STAR repeater system with other D-STAR repeater systems around the world. The system permits call sign calling and automatically routes the call through the internet to the last machine the desired operator was heard on that was connected to a gateway. To use the gateway you need to be admitted to the gateway system which allows you to use any gateway machine in the system. All IRC members in good standing can get gateway access. To get gateway access contact our D-STAR administrator Ed KB6THO and he will get you into the system.

Another exciting D-STAR development is the new DV dongle. The DV dongle (available at HRO) contains the D-STAR vocoder chip and assorted circuitry and plugs into the USB port of your computer. With the DV dongle and the associated free software, you can listen to or talk through D-STAR gateway equipped machines using your personal computer (a la Echolink). Any one can monitor our system with the
